Travelling by Train Promotes Sustainability

Travel to Arosa by public transport – the train ride from Chur* by the Rhaetian Railway is a truly enjoyable experience. The railway line has been in existence for over 100 years and takes you through forests, tunnels and over bridges, such as the famous Langwieser Viaduct in the Schanfigg valley. The Rhaetian Railway is strongly committed to sustainability and has been drawing 100 % of its electrical energy from hydropower since 2013. Another service on the Chur – Arosa – Chur route is the RhB Bear Train with the Bear Safari. On your way to the Arosa Bear Sanctuary, you can get in the mood for your visit by visiting the themed railway coach at no extra charge. The books that you will find on the train will tell you some exciting bear facts.

Free Use of Public Transport

In Arosa itself you can also take advantage of the free Arosa Bus, which will take you from A to B in Arosa. As an overnight guest, you receive the Arosa Card. This enables you to enjoy free travel on the route Lüen–Castiel to Arosa and return.

Note: This offer does not apply when travelling to/from your holiday or for travelling to school or work.

We wish you a pleasant journey to Arosa and are delighted that you are using our local public transport.



Enjoy a free return trip between Lüen–Castiel and Arosa on the Rhaetian Railway and discover the wild, romantic Schanfigg Valley. Not valid for journeys from/to work/school or for arrival/departure.

With the Arosa Card, you can use the blue Arosa bus free of charge. Timetable available at bus stops, online or from Arosa Tourism.

Mountain Railways

The Arosa Card includes use of all open stations of the Arosa mountain railways. Your Arosa Card is your ticket for the railways. As a foot passenger, you can get straight on to the train without queuing.

Bike transport: with the Arosa Card, you need an additional ticket for all mountain railways. Only the summer season ticket for Arosa Lenzerheide and the TOPCARD permit use of the Arosa Lenzerheide mountain railways with free bike transport included. All other offers are excluded. Subject to change.

Arosa-Schanfigg “Eggahuus” Local Museum

The local museum in Innerarosa recounts the history of the Arosa Schanfigg region from the oldest house in Arosa. With the Arosa Card, you can visit the museum free of charge every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from 2.30 p.m. – 4.30 p.m.

Untersee Lido

Leisure fun for young and old with natural swimming lake, children’s paddling pool, diving platform, beach volleyball court and the bathhouse by the lake which is a protected building.

Pedalos and Boats on the Obersee Lake

Enjoy an excursion by rowing boat or pedalo and drift away on the idyllic Obersee lake in front of the imposing mountains right next to the Arosa railway station.

Driving Range

The driving range at the Maran golf course is open to everyone who wants to practice their shots. Show the Arosa Card to the golf club secretary to use the range and clubs free of charge. 30 golf balls cost CHF 5.00. Daily from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., during high season from 8 a.m. – 6 p.m., children only permitted if accompanied by an adult. 30 golf balls cost CHF 5.00. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

Rope Park

Adventure high up in the trees. The Arosa rope park is in the midst of the natural woodland on the “Waldfestwiese”. With eight courses (two for children and six for youths and adults), we guarantee that all climbing fans will have a unique experience.

Conditions, requirements and important information

- All climbing fans must be physically and mentally fit and wear solid, closed shoes with a non-slip sole.
- The two children’s courses are suitable for children aged from four or six years respectively, and who are 100/120 cm tall.
- Children aged at least 9 and who are 140 cm tall or above may climb on other courses in the rope park.
- Children under 12 years of age may only climb if accompanied by an adult.
- The maximum permitted weight per climber is 120 kg.
- Equipment hire: For handling, checking and maintenance of the hired equipment (harness, helmet, gloves), we charge an equipment fee of CHF 5.00 for each guest who climbs on courses A to D, or H and J. As part of our “youth development” project, we do not charge for younger guests who only use the two children’s courses (K + L),
- Groups and schools of at least 12 persons can reserve their visiting times in advance from Monday to Friday (reservation fee CHF 200.00 per group). This reservation ensures that the equipment can be guaranteed for the required time period.

Novice mountain bikers and families have the perfect practice facility at the valley (bottom) station for the Hörnli Express. Four different trails prepare you for a bike adventure on the mountain. Open daily 8.45 a.m. – 4.30 p.m., free of charge.

Arosa Bear Sanctuary

Switzerland's first bear sanctuary accommodates up to five bears rescued from poor habitat conditions and provides a species-appropriate environment in the midst of Arosa's wonderful natural surroundings.

The Arosa Bear Foundation has established the innovative and sustainable project – Arosa Bear Sanctuary – in cooperation with the animal protection organisation VIER PFOTEN [FOUR PAWS]. Bears who were previously forced to live in tiny cages under miserable conditions have been freed from their terrible situation and brought to Arosa. The Arosa Bear Sanctuary is located at the middle station of the Arosa-Weisshorn cable car. The bears can revive their natural behaviours in the heart of the beautiful mountain landscape with meadows, bushes, rocks, several pools, forest, and snow.

At over 2000 m above sea level, the visitors are offered a unique production in a sustainable way. The entrance area of the visitor centre displays stories about the bears, films of their rescue are shown, and information is conveyed in an interactive way. The exhibition presents interesting facts specifically for children and adults. The bears can then be observed in the heart of nature from the visitor platform and the adventure trail. Of course, there is always a need for care; several keepers look after the welfare

of the Arosa bears and are happy to give visitors information about the latest events. In addition to the Arosa Bear Sanctuary, the Bear Mini Golf, the “Bear School” playground and the Bear Sanctuary adventure trail nearby offer fun for the whole family.

Napa, the first inhabitant of the Arosa Bear Sanctuary, was the last Serbian circus bear to be rescued in the summer of 2018. Thanks to Arosa and FOUR PAWS he has been able to live 2.5 enjoyable years in the Arosa Bear Sanctuary. In the meantime, more bears have been rescued, each bringing its own story and characteristics to Arosa. In the large enclosure of the Arosa Bear Sanctuary, each bear goes its own way – but at the same time lives in the presence of other bears. It's nature at its best!

Experiences

Viewing Platform

The viewing platform is the ideal place from which to observe the bears and enjoy Arosa's breathtaking mountain panorama. Various educational elements convey knowledge about animal protection and bears and make for an exciting visit. The information is suitable for both adults and children and perfectly completes the visit to the Arosa Bear Sanctuary. The sight of the bears in their natural surroundings of the Grison Alps is and will remain the highlight of your stay.

Adventure Path

The "floating" adventure path with eight viewing platforms which are connected to one another with suspension bridges takes you from the visitor platform out into the lofty heights in the direction of the northern enclosure. This is the location of the rocky part of the Arosa Bear Sanctuary enclosure.

Bear Mini Golf

The Bear mini golf offers fun for the whole family. The mini golf course with what is probably the most beautiful view in the world tells the story of how bears search for food during the summer months and eat as much fat as possible for their hibernation. The mini golf clubs and balls are available from the middle station.

Playground

The stimulating play area is right next to the middle station of the Arosa-Weisshorn cable car. The bear school curriculum includes climbing, balancing, jumping, sliding, enjoying the view, tracking and hiding.

Bear Sanctuary Adventure Trail

Set out and discover six species of bear on this family hiking trail. Find out where they live and how big they can become. The route leads from the Arosa Bear Sanctuary to the Tschuggen hut, past the Bergkirchli mountain chapel to the Kulmwiese.

The Weisshorn bear on the Weisshorn summit

On the Weisshorn summit at 2'653 m above sea level, there is there a photo point with the Weisshorn Bear, which definitely makes this a unique panoramic view. Pick up a wish bracelet from the Weisshorn summit, the nature laboratory, the Arosa Bear Sanctuary or from Arosa Tourism and tie it to the fur of the Weisshorn bear on the summit plateau.

The ArosaAkademie offers courses, tours and workshops covering a number of subject areas:


- People and animals

Hochwang Archery Park



The Hochwang mountain in the heart of the Schanfigg valley is home to two attractive and individually designed archery parks for young and old, expert and novice archers. In line with the motto “stretch to release”, the two perfectly designed courses delight their visitors with 28 life-size 3D animals. An ideal leisure activity for families, recreational archers, club and company events.

The Forest Archery Park

The varied forest archery course takes the archers along well-protected and marked paths through the secluded Fatscheler forest, past roaring streams, over rough and smooth, to the individual animals. Halfway round the circular course, the Janover Egg barbecue area is an ideal place to spend a little time enjoying the wonderful mountain views. The popular sport of archery is an adventurous fun activity for novices and expert archers.

The Alpine Archery Park

The alpine adventure archery park is located high above the tree line with views of the magnificent mountain backdrop. The archers walk from the Triemel panoramic restaurant through blooming mountain meadows up to the romantic Hochwang hut. The animals are securely positioned and are exciting targets for focussed archers. An even nature trail leads over fens and upland moors back to the starting point.

An introductory course is mandatory for novices and is included in the equipment price. Sturdy shoes are required. Reduced entry with the Arosa Card. Free parking. bogenpark-hochwang.ch

Alpine Hiking and Summit Tours

Some of the hikes lead through roadless terrain, over snowfields and scree slopes. Structural safety precautions should not be relied upon. If you feel up to the demands, nothing stands in the way of enjoying the alpine terrain our beautiful mountain world.

Long-distance Hiking Trails

Along the Schanfigger Höhenweg, the Jakobsweg, the Walser trail and the Mittelbünden-Panoramaweg, fascinating and charming long-distance hiking trails lead through Arosa and the Schanfigg.

Follow in historic Walser trails and discover various crossings and mountain passes, which were used as key access routes to Arosa from the Schanfigg valley.

Schanfigger Höhenweg Hiking Trail

The Schanfigg region is characterised by the two important centres of Chur and Arosa at the entrance and end of the valley. In between, there are small and medium-sized villages which, despite the tourist development of Arosa, have retained their original charm. Simple, harmonious wooden houses surrounded by meadows, hedges and larch forests line the winding mountain road. The mountain lakes, the old Walser settlements (Strassberg in FONDEI, Sapün and Medergen) and the mountain peaks worth discovering, such as Montalin and Mattjisch Horn, are all popular destinations. Experience a varied cultural landscape on the Schanfigger Höhenweg (High trail).

Let yourself be spoiled in an authentic Bergbeizli (mountain inn) or enjoy a picnic amongst unique alpine flora. The Schanfigger Höhenweg begins in Meiersboden in Chur and follows marked hiking trails to Tschierschen and Arosa, then to Medergen and then above the tree line via Sapün, FONDEI and Hochwang back to Chur.





Schanfigg Village Trail

The Schanfigg Dörferweg (village trail) is a new hiking trail which links the villages on both sides of the Schanfigg valley from Chur to Arosa.

The village trail leads through varied landscapes with impressive panoramic views, through meadows and forests, over wooded ravines, past mountain pastures and last but not least, over numerous bridges. The network of hiking trails, which total 52 kilometres, is well maintained and well signposted. So from the multi-day stage tour to a simple one-day hike to a village walk, there is something for every type of hiker.

In Arosa, the village trail starts at an altitude of 1743m and leads via Litzirüti and Langwies to Peist (1'333m). There the trail forks. On the right side of the valley, it leads to the Obertor tower in Chur (595m) via Fatschél (1'564m), St. Peter/Pagig, Castiel, Calfreisen and Maladers. On the other side of the valley, the village trail from Peist leads down to the village of Molinis (1'056m), which is located directly on the Plessur river, and then follows the Jakobsweg Graubünden up to Tschierschen (1'344m) and on to the Obertor tower in Chur via the Walser village of Praden and Passugg. The paths on the two sides of the valley (Praden and Pagig, Castiel) are connected via Lügen (991m).

The 52 km-long network of hiking trails is well maintained and well signposted. From a multi-day stage tour to a simple one-day hike to a village walk, there is something for every type of hiker. The individual stages can also be combined as a day trip with the Rhaetian Railway or the PostBus. The stages that give views of the Langwieser Viaduct are particularly striking.

An architectural construction of great importance to the history of the valley. The imposing bridge boasts a great size and might, and is a popular photo subject.

The village trail crosses valleys and rivers, and also smaller, no less rewarding paths. You may come across an idyllic wooden bridge, a scenic valley overpass or an extremely photogenic suspension bridge. For example, the Frauentobel gorge between Peist and Langwies was opened up for hiking for the first time with the construction of a new bridge. To ensure that the village trail lives up to its name, the varied route repeatedly leads through the traditional settlements in the Schanfigg valley. It is almost like being on a journey through time, strolling through the settlements that have preserved their original character, between grazing cows and flower-decorated village fountains. The classic wooden houses, with their sun-baked façades, are still well preserved and probably hide some secrets of the village's history. But, as well as the natural and cultural highlights, one thing makes the Schanfigg village trail special: the encounters you have on the way. Chatting at the village fountain, shopping in the farm shop, or enjoying a refreshment at a "Besenbeiz" inn all provide unforgettable memories. So what are you waiting for?

Hiking Trail Markings

The hiking trail network consists of all the interconnected hiking, mountain hiking and alpine hiking trails. As a rule, it is located outside the settlement area, covers areas particularly suitable for recreation, beautiful landscapes (panoramic views, shorelines, etc.), cultural sights and tourist facilities, and includes historical routes wherever possible.



Hiking trails are generally accessible and are usually reserved for hikers. They are as far from motorised traffic as possible and have no asphalt or concrete surfaces. Steep passages are overcome with steps and high drops are secured with railings. Streams or rivers are crossed on footbridges or bridges. Hiking trails do not place any special demands on the user. The hiking trails are marked with yellow.



Mountain hiking trails are hiking trails that partially cover impassable terrain. They are mostly steep and narrow and partially exposed. Particularly difficult passages are secured with ropes or chains. In some cases, streams may have to be crossed via fords. Users of mountain hiking trails must have sturdy shoes, be in good mental and physical health, and be aware of the dangers in the mountains (rock slides, danger of slipping and falling, sudden weather changes). The requirements are sturdy shoes with a good grip, equipment appropriate to the weather and topographical maps. The road signposts are yellow with a white-red-white point, confirmations and markings are white-red-white.



Alpine hiking trails are demanding mountain hiking trails. They lead partly through unpaved terrain, over snowfields and glaciers, over scree, through rockfalls or through rock with short climbing sections. Structural precautions should not be relied upon and are limited to securing particularly exposed areas where there is a risk of falling. Users of alpine hiking trails must be sure-footed, be in sound mental health and in very good physical shape and be able to handle ropes and pickaxes as well as to climb using hands. You must be aware of the dangers in the mountains. In addition to equipment for mountain trails, altimeters and compasses as well as ropes and ice picks are required for glacier crossings. The signposts are blue with a white-blue-white point, confirmations and markings are white-blue-white.

Conduct and Respect

Appropriate Behaviour

- Do not leave the officially marked hiking and biking trails.
- Small steps and a steady pace will save your strength uphill and protect your joints downhill.
- Never lean your upper body backwards when climbing down (danger of slipping).
- Even when you are not thirsty, drinking is important because the feeling of thirst lags behind the actual need for fluids.
- Avoid the risk of poor weather conditions, discomfort (weakness) or other difficulties.

The Five Rules for Hiking and Biking

- Keep a constant eye on the weather conditions.
- Make sure your equipment is appropriate and complete.
- Inform someone else about your route.
- Report back when you reach your destination.
- Observe the principle «when in doubt, head back.»
- Enjoy hiking and biking with a smile on your face.

Rules of conduct when encountering suckler cows (Source: wandern.ch)

- Please refer to the posted signs. Be quiet, do not chase or frighten the animals. Close the gate and follow the hiking or biking trail through the pasture. In general, cows are curious and are not dangerous.
- If the cows block your way, stay calm. Stay on the path if possible. If cows are standing on the hiking or biking trail, keep your distance and walk around the herd rather than through it. Do not scare the animals or turn your back on them.

- If you have a dog with you, put it on a leash and keep it under control. Dogs will attract the attention of cows, cattle and bulls and will stimulate defensive behaviour. Have your dog on the side away from the herd so that it is not visible. If your dog is on a leash when cows attack it, let go of the leash so the dog can escape. A dog is usually fast enough to avoid a cow attack.
- Signs that a cow feels threatened include raising and lowering of the head, snorting, scratching and roaring. If you notice these warning signs, leave the pasture slowly by walking backwards. Sudden movements are perceived as a threat by cows.

What to do in an Emergency

International emergency signal: give a signal six times a minute (e.g. shout, whistle, flash). Wait one minute. Repeat. Response: issue a signal three times a minute.

Culture

Arosa Kultur

The association, which was established in 1969, organises events and promotes culture in the region of Arosa. The association has more than 600 members. Arosa Kultur regularly organizes cultural and musical events.

Regular Music Concerts

Bergkirchli

The Bergkirchli mountain chapel was completed in 1493. It is the oldest building in Arosa. Its treasures include the late Gothic vaulted wooden ceiling, a large Maria bell from 1492 and a house organ with four registers from the first half of the 18th century. The mountain chapel is listed as a historical monument and is only accessible during church services, concerts or guided tours. Church services take place in the summer and winter seasons as well as Easter and New Year's Eve. The Bergkirchli mountain chapel is available to residents of Arosa and guests for baptisms, weddings, anniversaries, blessings, and funeral services.

Local History Museum Arosa-Schanfigg "Eggahuus"

The original purpose of the house on the "Egga", which was first mentioned in 1550, is unclear. It was probably some form of meeting place for the village residents, and this is still the case today. Various cultural events such as exhibitions, presentations and tours also take place in the rooms at the Arosa-Schanfigg "Eggahuus" local museum.

Kulturhuus Schanfigg

At Kulturhuus Schanfigg, local people and guests meet for lectures, readings, film evenings and art and cultural exhibitions. The Kulturhuus is also home to the Arosa-Schanfigg Cultural Centre, which promotes local cultural development, as well as the two accessible collections of the Raetica Library and the Schanfigg Cultural Archive.

Raetica Library

The Raetica library is from the estate of Major General Jörg von Sprecher from Jenins. The book collection dates back to the Free State of the Three Leagues. It includes valuable first editions of chronicles, as well as political writings prior to 1800, but also newspaper collections from the 19th century. It contains numerous modern publications on the history of Graubünden.

Schanfigg Cultural Archive

As a historical memory of Schanfigg, the cultural archive collects privately-owned legacies: documents, letters, books, pictures, maps, old brochures, etc. The submitted material is recorded and then prepared and exhibited in the collection according to the theme.

The Kulturhuus is open on Thursdays from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. Additional visiting times are possible on request.

The murals of the church in Lüen, which was built in 1084 and is listed as a historic monument, were covered up in the course of reformist aniconism and only uncovered in 1926. The wild mountain valley between Chur and Arosa has always preserved its original character and cultural peculiarities. It extends from Plessur at the foot of the valley up to the Mattjischhorn and into the picturesque side valleys of Fondei and Sapün. Calfreisen

Calfreisen lies on a sunny slope away from the main cantonal road. The small, tranquil village has a wonderful village centre. The symbol of Calfreisen is the ruined Bernegg castle, which was first mentioned in 1231.

Castiel

Castiel has been populated for an incredibly long time, various prehistoric settlement phases and Roman housing developments have been uncovered. The centrepiece of the village is the Podestat House, commonly known as the “Tobel Hus”. It was built in 1621 for the chief magistrate Luzius Schmid and is the most beautiful house and one of the most treasured historic buildings in the Schanfigg valley.

Lüen

Lüen, also known as the “Schanfigg Riviera” has such a mild climate that grapes, kiwis and apricots can grow. Since 1914, clean energy has been produced at the hydroelectric power station.

St. Peter–Pagig

The church of St. Peter with its mighty bell tower was first mentioned in 831. For centuries it was the most important church in the valley. The interior of the church houses a treasure of cultural and historical importance – a wall tabernacle dating from around 1500. On a sunny plateau above the villages of St. Peter and Pagig lies the hamlet of Fatschél, a former mountain pasture.

Molinis

Molinis used to be called “the garden of the Schanfigg”. Numerous plots of arable land and thriving fruit crops decorated the town. Today Molinis is successful with the Swiss biodiversity organisation, Pro Specie Rara, and is committed to the cultivation of pome (stone) fruits. The village with its sun-baked brown wooden houses has largely retained its charm.

Peist

Peist is a lively craft and farming village with village shops, inns and active clubs and societies. The large stone houses and the

striking onion-domed church tower can be seen from far and wide, and tell the story of the devastating village fire of 1874. The centre of the village is surrounded by farmhouses, hedges and meadows. A short walk takes you to the station where the oldest ash tree in Europe grows with an impressive trunk circumference of 9 metres.

Languies

The village takes its name from the “long wiese”, or meadow, on which the church was constructed. The many large pastures are the characteristic feature of the area. Until the 14th century, some locals used the pastures of the rear Schanfigg valley as Alps in the summer. Many river names come from this period. Then the Walser people began to migrate from Davos. They mainly settled in the higher side valleys. The Fondei, Sapün and Medergen valleys were separate villages and until the start of the 20th century, they were inhabited throughout the year and had more residents than the town down in the valley.

Litzirüti

The two sides of the valley which extend from Chur to Arosa and are intersected by the Plessur river, meet again at this point. “Litzi” means “in the shadows”. This is perfect for the small village because if you know where the shadows are, then the sun is not far away.

Public Transport

The different villages in the valley are easily accessible with public transport. The famous Rhaetian Railway stops everywhere on the stretch between Chur and Arosa. There is also a bus connection between Chur and Peist. The Hochwang area is connected with a shuttlebus. The shuttlebus travels from the RhB station St.Peter–Molinis to Fatschél and Triemel, and back.

Schanfigg Highlights



Countless hikes, unique sights, and varied activities are waiting for you. On the earlier pages, we have already presented some highlights such as the Hochwang Archery Park and the Schanfigg Village Trail. Here are a few more highlights. What are you waiting for?

Walser Settlements

You must have walked past and seen the original former Walser settlements in Fondei, Sapün and Medergen in the romantic side valleys at the rear of the Schanfigg valley. Peaceful and out of the way, yet close to the lively spa towns of Arosa, Davos and Klosters. Hikers are delighted by the primitive villages, which were previously inhabited all year round, and have no concrete or asphalt. Fondei, Sapün and Medergen are considered real insider tips. Few high valleys in the Alps have such a well-preserved, typical Walser cultural landscape. Narrow, sun-baked wooden houses lie spread out or in village groups in the flowering alpine meadows. Narrow paths connect them and lead to the nearby mountain ridges. Until the 20th century, the settlements were inhabited throughout the year. The major changes of the last century led to emigration into the valley. However, the high valleys continue to be carefully used for agriculture and are therefore worth a visit.

Bernegg Castle

On a spur in the tranquil village of Calfreisen, you will find Bernegg Castle – the ruins of a medieval hilltop castle from the middle or the second half of the 13th century. The former tower with a floor plan of about 11 by 13 and a tower height of 15 metres is not accessible, but remains of the wall plaster, isolated narrow slits and a smoke exhaust testify to its former use.

It is documented that the castle was owned by the Lords of Calfreisen from 1259 to 1286. The castle was probably only named “Bernegg” in the course of the 15th century when it came into the possession of the Sprecher family.

Fresh from the Farm

This is the most authentic way to buy your products. A number of farm shops offer delicacies straight from the farm. Enjoy home-made yoghurt, traditional Salsiz sausages and other local products.

Langwies Viaduct

The town came to the attention of the world in 1912 when the Langwies viaduct was constructed. What was built here more than 100 years ago represents pioneering work in a class of its own. As well as travelling across the viaduct, there are other ways to marvel at its magnificence. Take a walk from the Langwies railway station and as you walk around the village, you can discover a number of new perspectives and imposing subjects for photos.

Sun on the Hochwang

The sun-drenched Hochwang mountain plateau lies in the heart of the Schanfigg valley. This area, surrounded by magnificent mountains and unspoilt nature, could have been made for panoramic hikes and family excursions. What’s more: in winter, you can find eleven prepared natural ski slopes here and winter fun for young and old.

Churches

The churches of the traditional villages conceal a wealth of treasures. Impressive church towers and elaborate paintings make each church unique. The church in Lüen hold regular tours to see the murals created by the workshop of the Waltenburg masters. The following churches are open to the public: St. Peter, Lüen, Peist, Langwies, Molinis.

Zipline - Pradaschier Adventure Mountain

With the zipline, you are securely fastened to a wire cable as you fly towards the valley at up to 110 km/hr. The flight lasts almost 2 minutes and covers 1,739 m with a difference in altitude of 470 m. After the gentle start, there are inclines of 29% which create a feeling of freefall, which is very close to flying. The zipline provides adventure, thrills and adrenaline, all with the maximum safety precautions. Travel to the start on foot or with the four-person chair lift. Clip in, take off and enjoy the feeling of weightlessness: a unique experience for young and old!
